2018-19 School Improvement Council

A new School Renewal Plan was written and reviewed as required by the Council.

School Safety procedures were reviewed and re-examined. All staff completed updated annual safety training and participated in monthly drills for fire, semester drills for active shooter/intruders, and the annual tornado drill.

Creative Arts received an "Average" rating on the 2018 South Carolina School Report Card. We are proud that all subgroups made annual growth in the area of achievement.

The entire Creative Arts staff's commitment to creating classroom communities through daily class meetings and school-wide assemblies had a significant effect on student participation and behavior in every classroom. In addition, a well organized Parent Teacher Organization supported teachers and students and through fundraising efforts and partnership with the District were able to build a greenhouse in the SCA courtyard.

In addition to monitoring the School Renewal Plan, the Council elected to investigate and then plan for a way to engage parents and the community in activities that support teachers, and their classroom needs, as well as a school-wide project, for the upcoming 2019-20 school year. This project will be an online opportunity for parents and the community to donate supplies and materials to teachers and support projects that fill a school need.

The Council also continued to focus on issues relating to being a quality Arts-Infused STEAM school of choice, student academic achievement, school climate, teacher retention/morale and communication.
