School Improvement Council

The School Renewal Plan was reviewed and updated by the SIC.

School Safety procedures were reviewed and re-examined, specifically with regard to COVID-19 and the HHIESCA reopening plan, available upon request in the office and on our school website. All staff completed updated annual safety training and participated in monthly drills for fire, semester drills for active shooter/intruders, and the annual earth-quake and tornado drill during the 2020-2021 school year.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, assessment data and other data was not recorded on the 2019 SC School Report Card. In Spring of 2021, teachers, parents, and students have received the opportunity to complete the School Report Card Opinion survey for the academic year. Students in grades 3-5 are taking the SC READY assessment in the areas of Reading, Writing, and Math, and 4th graders will take the SC PASS Science assessment in Spring 2021.

Our school continues in its focus to provide a rich, Arts-infused environment as a school of choice on the island, and the SIC partners with internal and external stakeholders to promote a school climate characterized by exceptional student academic achievement, teacher retention/morale, and communication.

All teachers at HHIESCA continue to implement Responsive Classroom practices in classroom learning communities, and have additionally utilized PBIS incentives and strategies within classrooms as a means to reinforce with students expected and positive behaviors. The school SIC continues to support the endeavors of staff in working with all students to facilitate academic, social, and emotional growth and works together to determine ways in which the community may engage with the school to support all learners.
