# **School Improvement Report**

Dear School Community,

The School Improvement Council (SIC) continues to be mandated by the state of South Carolina for the purpose of overseeing the School Renewal Plan and acting in an advisory role to the school's administrative team. Each year the SIC is charged with making an annual report to the school's community. Included in this newsletter you will find important information about the school and the progress and challenges that we face in our school improvement efforts.

Our goals are to ensure that all students are successful academically, to close the achievement gap between subgroups in our school, as a school of choice, to provide an Arts Infused approach to learning, to provide a safe learning environment, to provide good communication and to foster partnerships with our community. This year staff and students implemented **STEAM** (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Math) units of study and are on track for an onsite visit by AdvancED to become STEM certified.

# 2017-18 School Improvement Council

The School Renewal Plan was updated and reviewed as required by the Council.

School Safety procedures were reviewed and re-examined. The SIC chair and principal attended the districtwide safety meeting with local law enforcement. All staff completed updated annual safety training and participated in monthly drills for fire, semester drills for active shooter/intruders, and the annual tornado drill.

The entire Creative Arts staff's commitment to creating classroom communities through daily class meetings and schoolwide monthly assemblies had a significant effect on student participation and behavior in every classroom. In addition, a well organized Parent Teacher Organization supported teachers and students and through fundraising efforts and partnership with the district were able to upgrade the playground equipment.

In addition to monitoring the School Renewal Plan, the Council elected to do a building inspection to identify and prioritize projects to submit to the district office for consideration for placement on the permanent improvement district-wide plan. The SCA Uniform Policy was reviewed and amended for the coming school year.

The Council also continued to focus on issues relating to being a quality Arts-Infused school of choice, STEM certification, student academic achievement, school climate, teacher retention/morale and communication.
