The school staff was surveyed to look at school climate. The school renewal plan was updated and reviewed as required.

The school again received an "Excellent" rating on the South Carolina Department of Education School Report Card and revieved the Palmetto Gold Award for academic achievement. The rating validates the work and commitment of the school and the SIC to student achievement.

In addition to monitoring the School Renewal Plan, the Council elected to focus on the recommitment and focus on being an exemplary arts focused school and supported the administrations recommendation to begin the accreditation process of becoming a model STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Math) school. The Council continued to focus on issues relating to student academic achievement, school related health and safety issues and communication.



This Report is issued by the Daufuskie Island Elementary School Improvement Council in accordance with South Carolina Law to share information on the school's progress in meeting various goals and objectives, the work of the SIC, and other accomplishments during the 2014-15 school year.

SIC Annual Goals

The School Improvement Council monitored the five-year School Renewal Plan with a focus on student achievement, health and school safety and home-school-community communications.

Goal 1: Improve Student Achievement.

- A. Increase Reading and Math skills by meeting growth goals as measured by the MAP (Measure of Academic Performance) and South Carolina PASS (Palmetto Assessment of State Standards) tests.
- B. Implement strategies and support for students to read on or above grade level. Guided Reading, Independent Reading Program and additional tutoring for identified students were implemented.

Goal 2: Improve Student Health and School Safety Measures.

- A. Install safety measures that include entrance, landscaping and monitoring cameras.
- B. Complete permanent improvement projects that include roof repairs, painting, new tile and new classroom air conditioning units.
- C. Continue student yoga program.

Goal 3: Implement activities that support strong communication and involvement with parents and the Daufuskie Island Community.

- A. Employment of community-based staff for music, physical education, technology, speech and tutoring.
- B. Monthly joint SIC/PTO meetings.
