HHIESCA Performance Goals

School Renewal Plan Goals for 2021-2022:

The five goals listed below follow the framework of the Beaufort County School District Five Year Strategic Plan. Within our School Renewal Plan are specific strategies and activities that are implemented, monitored and updated annually. A copy of the entire plan is on file at the school and available upon request for review.

- Goal 1: Student Achievement in Reading: By the end of the 2023-24 year, the percentage of students in grades 3 through 5 who score Meets or Exceeds Expectations in ELA as measured by SC Ready will increase from 40.2% on the 2018 SC School Report Card to 55%.
- Goal 2: Student Achievement/Closing the Achievement Gap in Reading and Math: By the end of the 2023-2024 school year, the achievement gap that exists between the white subgroup of students at Creative Arts and both the Hispanic and African American subgroups will be reduced 12 percentage points at each grade level in both reading and math.
- Goal 3: Teacher and Administrator Quality: By the end of the 2023-24 year, HHIESCA will increase the teacher retention rate from 83% to 90% through initiatives that support strengthening of school climate by implementation of PBIS and consistent best practices across the school environment.
- Goal 4: School Climate/Parent, Teacher, Student Relations and Engagement: By the end of the 2023-24 school year, HHIESCA parent, student and teacher satisfaction ratings from SC School Report Card survey data will increase from 73.3% satisfaction by parents to 80%; 84.7% to 90% by students and 82.3% to 90% by teachers.
- Goal 5: School Climate/Student Engagement: By the end of the 2023-24 school year, the school climate at Hilton Head Island Elementary School for the Creative Arts as measured by the South Carolina Department of Education Report Card Student Engagement Survey Results, will increase from the Average rating received in 2019-20 to a Good Rating.

School Improvement Council

The School Renewal Plan was reviewed and updated by the SIC.

School safety and facilities were reviewed collaboratively by SIC shareholders inclusive of school administration, staff, parents and community members. All staff completed updated annual safety training and participated in monthly drills for fire, semester drills for active shooter/intruders, and the annual earthquake and tornado drill during the 2021-22 school year. All students received opportunity for age-appropriate CAPA (Child Abuse Prevention Association) lessons via the BCSD partnership with CAPA Beaufort, during HHIESCA classroom guidance time.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, assessment data and other data was not recorded on the 2020 SC School Report Card. In Spring of 2022, teachers and students are receiving the opportunity to complete the School Report Card Opinion survey for the academic year. Students in grades 3-5 are taking the SC READY assessment in the areas of Reading, Writing, and Math, and 4th graders will take the SC PASS Science assessment in May.

Our school continues in its focus to provide a rich, Arts-infused environment as a school of choice on the island, and the SIC partners with internal and external stakeholders to promote a school climate characterized by exceptional student academic achievement, teacher retention/morale, and communication.

HHIESCA administrators, teachers and staff have adopted a focus dedicated to streamlining behavioral and academic practices consistently across the school, through use of PBIS incentives, Social Emotional Learning (SEL) curriculum and strategies within classrooms as a means to reinforce with students expected and positive behaviors, and promote overall wellness. The school SIC continues to support the endeavors of staff in working with all students to facilitate academic, social, and emotional growth and works together to determine ways in which the community may engage with the school to support all learners.
