School Program

In January 2001, Hilton Head Island Elementary School was one of the first schools in the United States to be authorized as an International Baccalaureate (IB)/Primary Years Programme (PYP) school. In accordance with the International Baccalaureate Organization standards, the school was reauthorized in 2009 and again in 2014. The IB curriculum is articulated from the elementary school through the high school, with the Primary Years Programme, the Middle Years Programme and the Diploma Programme.

In addition to an excellent standardsbased, transdisciplinary academic curriculum. HHIE offers students and their families a wide variety of activities to enrich their lessons and to expand their interests. There is a heavy focus on character education development and taking "action." The teachers differentiate to meet the needs of each individual student including providing opportunities for rigor and acceleration, as well as support with remediation. We are committed to language learning, whether it is with fostering English development skills for students that are identified as English Learners, learning content language through our Chinese and Spanish Dual-Language Immersion programs, and our daily Kids Interacting Through Learning Language (KITE-LL) Spanish program. All of this is done under the framework and philosophy of the IB model.
