Review of 2023-2024 School Renewal

Goals Accomplished: Curriculum

- *Data was used to analyze students' needs and plan instruction.
- *Reading intervention instruction was implemented through the reading initiative.
- *Two reading intervention teachers were funded through Title 1 funds to support K-2nd literacy.
- *Teachers participated in staff development with a focus on writing instruction.
- *Fountas and Pinnell testing data was used to guide reading instruction.

School Environment

- *Surveys were used to determine staff development needs which were addressed throughout the year.

- *Positive communication was sent home via positive notes home, Jefferson SOAR system
- *The Student Ambassadors planned and implemented several service-learning projects throughout the year.
