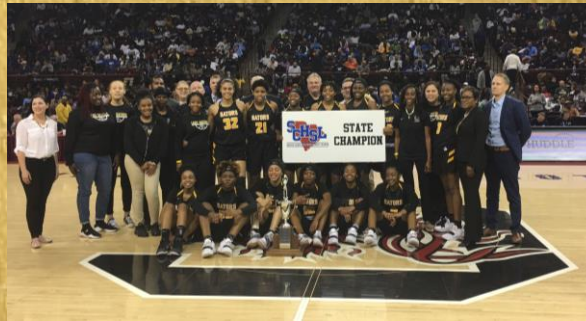


BERKELEY CENTER FOR THE ARTS



The Berkeley Center for the Arts continued to establish itself as one of the premier arts programs in the southeast with another stellar year on the local, regional, and national stage. The Visual Arts program dominated the Coastal Carolina Fair with a bevy of awards, including Exchange Club Winner, Judges Award Winner, and several first place ribbons. Three students from the Strings program made All County Orchestra this year, while Wind & Percussion had six students earn All-State honors and twenty-nine students earned All-Region honors. The Dance program took home hardware at several competitions this year, including the Charleston Jewish Foundation Holocaust Creative Arts Competition, where they took home 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place honors. The Drama Department participated in the International Thespian competition at Winthrop University, earning a superior rating along the way, and nabbed the lead role in Charleston Stage's production of *The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-Hood*. Student productions included *Little Shop of Horrors* and *Clue*. The Creative Writing program earned its sixth National Gold Award, as part of the Scholastic Art & Writing Awards, and a trip to Carnegie Hall in New York City. Students were published in several literary journals, and will feature writers at the Piccolo Spoleto Arts Festival this spring, as well as the prestigious University of Iowa Young Writer's Studio in June. Voice students completed a record breaking year, taking home 1st prize at the Lander Choral Festival in Greenville and didn't stop there. In Atlanta, Georgia, participating in the WorldStrides Heritage Festival, the Chamber Choir received a superior rating and 1st place overall. Several students qualified for Nationals while competing at the National Association of Teacher of Singing Student Auditions at Towson University in Maryland, and another was accepted into the renowned Washington National Opera Summer Institute for a performance at the Kennedy Center in Washington, DC. A record 11 Voice students took home All-State Chorus honors.

ATHLETICS



Goose Creek Athletics had a very successful year with several varsity teams making the playoffs. Girls Basketball repeated once again as Region 7 5A Champions. They went on to win their 3rd State Championship. Coach Tim Baldwin was also named coach of the year for USA Today, the Lowcountry, Region 7 5A, and the High School Sports Report. GCH had 2 wrestling State qualifiers with Israel Schultz winning a State Championship. Several cheerleaders were privileged with being selected to cheer in the All American Half-Time Show for the Citrus Bowl in Orlando, Florida. Fifteen GCHS student athletes signed with colleges to continue their playing careers at the next level. Goose Creek student athletes excelled not only on the field, but in the classroom as well with several athletes earning academic scholarships. Our Athletic Director, Mr. Chris Buchholz was recognized and named Region 7 5A Athletic Director of the Year.

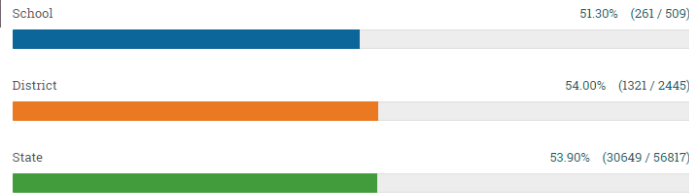
*Goose Creek High School's DECA Club competed and placed in the top 10 in 11 events at the State Competition.

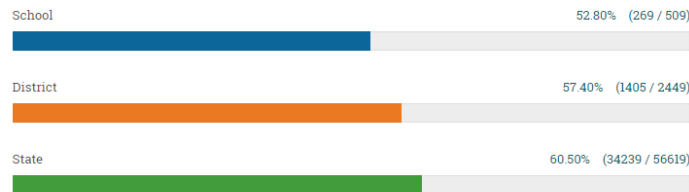


End-of-Course Assessment Results in English 1 and Algebra 1
