Berkeley Middle School (BMS) is a diverse 6th through 8th-grade middle school that serves the Moncks Corner community by providing an academic curriculum and extracurricular activities for over 1,400 students. Over 100 dedicated faculty and staff members work daily to provide our students with a positive learning experience in a safe, caring, and inclusive environment. BMS is recognized as a Unified Champion School for creating an environment where every student is accepted and respected. The Unified Program at BMS provides students with opportunities in PE, Music, and Art.

Our school is helping all students develop the world-class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the South Carolina Graduate by challenging them with a rigorous curriculum provided through quality teaching, support, enrichment, and reinforcement from our teachers. BMS promotes world-class knowledge by offering Carnegie Units for Algebra 1, English 1, Spanish 1, CS Discoveries, Band, Orchestra, Chorus, and Art. Over 350 students took advantage of the opportunity to earn high school credit by enrolling in these courses. Students were also provided with opportunities for remediation of specific standards through the use of our Study Labs.

Students at BMS are provided opportunities to express their artistic creativity through a strong fine and performing arts department consisting of chorus, band, strings, theatre, and visual arts course offerings.

BMS students are afforded opportunities to develop life and career characteristics throughout the school year by participating in activities organized by our Guidance Department and our Career Specialist. BMS expanded opportunities for students to develop interpersonal skills and leadership through FCA, the Unified courses, and the Renaissance Club! As an official Renaissance school during the 2021-22 school year, BMS held a number of events recognizing the achievements of our students!
