Statistical data demonstrates a pattern of improvement as well as areas in which we need to concentrate to continue growth.



Academic Accomplishments

- 170 out of 262 students had a 3.0 or higher- This makes 65% of our graduating class eligible for a state lottery scholarship.
- 26 achieved the Seals of Biliteracy, which means these students are fluent in more than 1 language. This is the highest in the district!
- 10 students received Palmetto Fellows, the highest state scholarship given.
- 10 students entered the military.
- 10 students graduated from Aiken Technical College with an Associate's degree through our Early College Program.
- 13 scholarships were granted by Leavelle McCampbell School Alumni Association totaling \$26,000 & six \$1000 scholarships were given by the MVHS alumni association, quadrupled from last year.
- 70% are considered college or career ready by the state of SC. This number proves that upon graduation, our Valley students are ready, prepared, and motivated to enter the workforce or college directly. Acceptances to colleges and universities were in 24 states including Howard, University of Virginia, Norwich University, Florida State, Embry Riddle Aeronautical University. Students were accepted to every major college and university in SC! 164 of these seniors received a career completer certificate, 25 students received over \$100,000 in scholarships, 16 received over \$250,000, 6 received over \$500,000, and 1 student netted over \$2.5 million in scholarship offers.

MVHS had the highest scholarship amount in history with over \$20,376,019 offered in scholarship money.

Spanish Club & French Club

This year, the Spanish teachers (Bush, Lee, and Giron) welcomed our Spanish speaking parents to three meetings. Mr. Giron and Mr. Bush taught our parents how to use Apptegy and PowerSchool. We tackled important issues like vacainations and attendance. Mrs. Lee was able to show parents how their students can use PowerPoint to translate what their teachers are saying in real time. We also took the time to have a guestioning and answering session.

With 52 members, we have the largest number ever in our National Spanish Honors Society! The Seal of Biliteracy had 65 students sign up for the exam which is a record number for MVHS. Mrs. Lee opened a Group on Schoology and posted resources to study and practice test so the students can study independently.



Our Spanish and French students represented MVHS again at Winthrop University in the World Language Competition. Our students brought home ribbons: 2 Blues in Spanish writing and speaking, 2 reds French in writing and speaking, and 1 white Spanish in writing.
