The School Store ran by DECA and students in the Marketing Program reopened this year. The students rebranded it and turned it into a café, Stomping Grounds Café. They sell coffees, flavored lemonades, tea, and slushies. Students who work in the café not only gain real-world, 21st century skills they also have a chance to receive certifications and work-based learning. Proceeds from the café go directly back into the school. The money raised is used to keep the café running and cover expenses for students to receive certifications, attend conventions, and compete in competitions. Five students competed in the regional DECA competition this year and all five placed in the top three in their divisions. Also, 16 students received OSHA-10 and Microburst Employment Skills certifications. So far this has been very successful, and students in the entire school benefit from it.

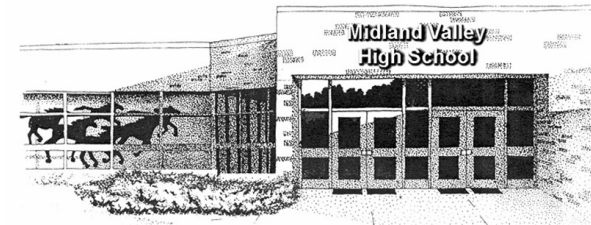

The Palmetto State School Counselor Association (PSSCA) awarded mini-grants to South Carolina school counselors to provide programs and activities to enhance the delivery of a comprehensive school counseling program in South Carolina elementary, middle, and high schools. MVHS EARLY COLLEGE

Midland Valley started the EARLY COLLEGE program with 18 students in its first cohort. An additional 28 students were enrolled in each of the 2nd, 3rd, and 4th cohorts. The 5th cohort welcomed 35 students and the 6th an additional 32. We will begin cohort 7 with 34 students. Students who complete Early College will earn an Associate degree while they earn a High School Diploma. To date and through the hit the program took through the pandemic, we have graduated 46 students with 15 more to graduate in May 2022!

MVHS expanded our collaboration with ATC by adding Dual Enrollment courses outside of Early College. We enrolled 38 students in Fall of 2019 for Dual Enrollment taught on MV campus. 24 students enrolled in Fall of 2020, and we increased to 45 students enrolled in Fall of 2021. We have 49 students set to begin this program in Fall of 2022.
