Academic Accomplishments

- MVHS offers AP U.S. History, AP Biology, AP Calculus, AP Language, AP Literature, AP Chemistry, AP Environmental Science, AP Human Geography, AP World History, AP Psychology, AP European History, and AP Studio Art.
- This year 7 students received the Watson Brown Scholarship which is \$6000 a year renewable for 4 years. This ties another high school for the most Watson Brown scholarships awarded and also sets a record for the most from MVHS.
- Our students have been accepted to over 48
 colleges and universities around the United
 States. One student will be attending the
 University of Virginia, and one will be attending
 Howard University.

Last year, MVHS had the highest scholarship amount in the district with over \$18,073,241 being offered in scholarship

money.
