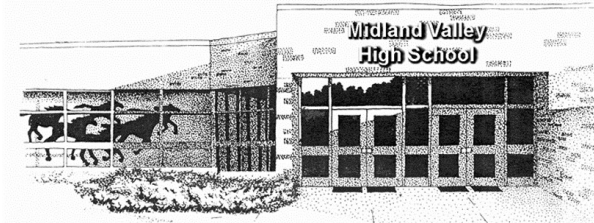




Midland Valley High School

Student/ Athletic Accomplishments

- Boys Basketball team won the 3-A State Championship.
- Eight athletic teams qualified for the 2014 state playoffs.
- Over 500 students volunteered at various events throughout the year.
- One student named 3-A State Player of the Year in basketball.
- Eight players were nominated for All-State honors in their sport.
- Five athletes participated in North-South All-Star Games.
- The NJROTC Rifle team won their 3rd Consecutive Area 6 Championship, 5th in the Southeast and 18th on the National Level.

- Only School in Aiken County to receive Gold for both categories.
- Graduation Rate of 84.6%
- EOC Overall Passing Rate increased from 73.4% to 75.8%.
- MVHS offers *Advanced Placement* courses in U.S. History, Biology, Calculus, English, Chemistry, Psychology, European History and Human Geography.
- MVHS students taking courses at the *Aiken County Career & Technology Center* have repeatedly clinched district, state and national titles.
- Seventy-three rising 9th graders participated in a Math and English Summer Transition Program.
- Community service projects included the following: *Valley's Empty Stocking Fund, Relay for Life, Special Olympics, American Heart Association, Marine Corps Toys for Tots, The United Way of Aiken and The Debbie Knight Foundation.*
- Staff members donated over \$6400 to local charities and donated \$1200 to an elementary school for our "Operation Feed a Kid" program.
- The National Art Honors society donated 30 bowls to the CSRA Empty Bowl Program.
