SCHOOL REPORT CARD DATA FROM 2023-2024

The South Carolina College and Career-Ready Assessments (SC READY) program is a statewide assessment in English Language Arts (ELA), mathematics, and science administered to students in grades 3–8 as required by the Education Accountability Act (EAA). Grades 6-8 take the ELA and Math assessments, while grade 6 also takes the Science assessment. Schools are also measured on their students' academic growth, MLL learner proficiency, and school climate.

ACADEMIC AND SCHOOL HIGHLIGHTS 24-25

Paul Knox Middle School continues to foster student success through Patriot Progress Monitoring, where students set goals and receive targeted interventions from teachers using CAI. To celebrate their achievements, we host Semester 1 and Semester 2 recognition events for students meeting all criteria. We also recognize Students of the Month for students who exhibit the traits of P.R.I.D.E (Perseverance, Respect, Integrity, Dependability, Excellence)

Beyond the classroom, our students thrive in a variety of clubs and organizations, including Beta Club, Student Leadership, and Buddy Club, which promote leadership, service, and community involvement. Our fine arts programs continue to shine—our orchestra earned a Superior with Distinction, the band received an Excellent rating with Superiors in Sightreading, and our chorus proudly represented Paul Knox at the Carowinds Festival while also earning numerous spots in the prestigious Aiken All-County Chorus.

Our active PTO continues to play a vital role in school life—hosting dances, providing meals for faculty and staff, and organizing popular events like Pizza Fridays. Their support helps build the strong, connected community that makes Paul Knox Middle School such a special place to learn and grow.

In athletics, our girls' basketball team capped off an undefeated season by winning the Middle School County Championship, and academically, our district-champion academic team will represent us on the national stage in Chicago this May. We are especially proud of our Special Olympics athletes, who represented Paul Knox with pride, sportsmanship, and determination throughout the year.

Throughout the school year, we have hosted many events that showcase our students' talents, leadership, and commitment to the community. Our Christmas program highlighted both student performances and the generosity of our school family. Our Black History program brought us together in reflection and celebration of unity and inclusion.
