Synergistic Lab

LBC's 7th and 8th graders visit the lab throughout the year with their Science and Math teachers. They explore such concepts as Robotics, Energy, Power & Mechanics, Plastics & Polymers, and Alternative Energy with the hands-on, interactive, electronic modules.

Academics

- 100% of our English I and Algebra I students passed the EOC test.

- LBC offers 5 subjects for high school credit: English I, Algebra I, Spanish, Keyboarding, Chorus, and Strings.
