Our Purpose

Think Pink!

In the summer of 2013, the professional learning community of LBC read *A Whole New Mind* by Daniel Pink. During the 2013-14 school year, teachers facilitated the learning of Pink's six traits: Empathy, Symphony, Meaning, Design, Story, and Play. LBC teachers taught these traits in memorable units such as The Great Art Heist and the Ethics of Transplants (7th Grade Science), Not Disabilities, Abilities: Designing Adaptive Playgrounds (6th Grade ELA), Penning Children's Stories with Little Bird Tales (7th Grade ELA), Fun With Finances and Globetrotting: The 7 Wonders of the World (Gen Ed), The Big Egg Drop (6th Grade Science), 14 Cows for America: Reflections on 9/11 (8th Grade ELA), Height and Breadth: Scatterplots, Correlations, and Graphs (8th Grade Math).
