

Our Purpose

The mission of Langley-Bath-Clearwater Middle School is to deliver quality instruction that fosters high academic achievement and social development, preparing our students for 21st Century careers and lifelong learning in a safe, nurturing environment in collaboration with the home and community.

Our Direction

We at Langley-Bath-Clearwater Middle School seek to prepare our students for the 21st Century by providing a curriculum rich in Science, Technology, Arts, and Mathematics. Our goal is to develop students of character and leadership who will become life-long learners and contributors to society and their community. They will be well equipped academically to pursue high school and postsecondary education that will prepare them for the career of their choice and to provide solutions to tomorrow's challenges.

Professional Development

Teachers and administrators have engaged this year in professional development related to our new Aiken County 1:1 technology initiative. In this year of Covid-19, Aiken County Public Schools has fully adopted a 1:1 initiative by providing every student with a laptop for school and home use. Teachers completed a 6 week training course on various online modules they could use for online instruction during our hybrid model during quarantine, as well as during full face to face instruction the 2nd half of this school year.

Technology Updates

With the distribution of laptops to all students, LBC purchased every teacher a class set of mice and a charging station. We also purchased wireless adaptors so teachers would have the ability to connect their laptops to their smartboard and document cameras to use with their smartboard. In addition, we purchased 6 class sets of headphones.

Academics

- LBC offers 5 subjects for high school credit: English I, Algebra I, Geometry, Spanish I, and Fundamentals of Computing.
- During our Acceleration Period, students have learned about medical careers in HOSA, polished their leadership skills in Student Council, prepared to be future teachers in ProTeam, demonstrated their academic expertise in Academic Team, practiced thinking green by building Future Cities, and created memories in Yearbook.

Spanish

One of LBC's exploratory options is Spanish. All grades at LBC now have the opportunity to learn a foreign language, instead of only the top 25 as was done in previous years.

Field Trips and Guest Speakers

LBC students were not able to participate in our numerous enriching events due to Covid-19. Mrs. Greene's class did have a musician guest speaker, Sam Reider, via Zoom and learned a lot participating in a discussion with him. We conducted virtual Veteran's Day and Black History celebrations, Awards Day, Pep Rallies, and our Christmas program. We did hold two Book Fairs in person in conjunction with a Food Truck for the students, staff and community. We were able to hold the Miss LBC Pageant with a few adjustments for Covid-19. Each grade level debuted separately for social distancing, tracking and sanitizing purposes. Audience members were seated with family and adequate spacing was insured, and outgoing guests exited away from incoming guests.
