EXTRA CURRICULAR & SPORTS

2023-2024 HIGHLIGHTS

- Our school engaged in schoolwide Active Learning using a variety of instructional strategies centered around students to allow for meaningful, engaging activities, and continued support of Empowered Instruction of Leader in Me by promoting student ownership of learning.
- LMMS has implemented its 4th year as a Leader in Me School with the 7 Habits of Highly Effective People being infused through direct lessons in advisory and classroom lessons. LMMS continues to implement these programs. The school achieved Lighthouse Certification in 2023.
- On the Winter 2024 MRA survey, LMMS scored Exemplary in Social Support which improved by 14 points from the Fall 2023 survey. Students feel they have one or more teachers who provide them with the encouragement and support they need to lead their learning.
- WEB is a middle school orientation and transition program that welcomes 6th graders and makes them feel comfortable throughout the first year of their middle school experience. This program is built on the belief that students can help students' success, the program trains mentors from 8th grader class to be WEB leaders. As positive role models, WEB leaders are mentors and student leaders who guide the 6th graders to discover what it takes to be successful during the transition to middle school and help facilitate 6th grade success.
