

SCHOOL CLIMATE

To achieve our goal of making all stakeholders feel like valued members of the Bobcat family, we will:

- Use PBIS to celebrate students' accomplishments and achievement of goals.
- Improve social-emotional skills through the use of Second Step and Rethink Ed curriculum.
- Institute a Bobcat Buddies program to foster mentoring between middle and high school students.
- Leverage student council to launch student-led initiatives that amplify student voice and foster leadership development.
- Increase parent involvement through consistent communication, meaningful engagement opportunities, and inclusive school events
- Enhance student connectedness and belonging through inclusive activities, student leadership, and supportive relationships.

ACADEMICS

To enhance student performance and strengthen teacher capacity, we have implemented the following action steps:

- Encourage students to explore career clusters within the CTE department to increase students' completion of a CTE program.
- Build teacher literacy and mathematics content knowledge across the curriculum so that students have access to rigorous course pathways and enrichment opportunities.
- Ensure strategic scheduling that provides structured time within the school day for preteaching and opportunities for extensions and re-teaching.
- Cultivate a school-wide brand of excellence by setting high academic expectations, promoting rigorous instruction, and celebrating student achievement across all content areas.

Baptist Hill Middle High School serves students in 6-12th grades. We are a small community school with a current enrollment of 501 students. On average, our student teacher ratio is 15 to 1.
