St. John's High School is home to over 300 students. Students at St. John's are among the brightest in the county, demonstrating proficiency and growth along their four years with us.

Highlights:

- 83% of parents are satisfied with home school relations
- 84.7% of parents are satisfied with the social and physical environment
- 100% of parents are satisfied with the learning environment
- 79.2% of students graduated in 4 years
- 34% met the ACT Benchmark in English
- 8.2% met the ACT Benchmark in Math
