All students in Algebra I passed the End of Course Exam (EOC) and 96% passed EOC for English I.

Significant increases in the scores of 8th graders were noted on the PASS exams. In the 8th grade, ELA PASS scores increased by 20 percentage points from last year and increased by more than 13.2 percentage points in mathematics.

Eighth graders also increased in social studies PASS scores by 17 percentage points and in science by more than 15 percentage points.
