

- NAMS had the District Martin Luther King Essay Contest winner.

- Student Council raised \$1416.00 in their efforts for Walk for A Cure. They collected 1,661 pounds of food for the Golden Harvest Food Bank. Ten children were adopted for the North Augusta Community Christmas Project and Student Council participated in the United Way Be A Bunny Program.
- Several NAMS students have been invited to participate in the acGATEWAY program for 4 weeks this Summer. This program is designed for gifted and talented students in the visual and performing arts.
- NAMS had the Middle School State DAR winner.
- NAMS students won both 1st and 2nd place in the Middle School division of North Augusta Idol.
- 100 NAMS students grades 6-8 qualified for the National Junior Beta Club.
- NAMS students won 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in the Nancy Carson Library Ghost Story Essay Contest.
- NAMS had three students place 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in the CSRA Regional Science Fair at USCA.
 One student placed 2nd place OVERALL and two students received the Broadcom MASTERS Award.
