- Local Business and Industry partners joined NAMS students at a Leadership Expo. The Expo provided the students with exposure to a variety of careers and jobs by connecting them with business partners. The activities are designed to: Provide a realistic picture of the workplace, make the connection between school and the workplace, learn information about the job market, and practice soft skills. Other career awareness activities include grade level Career Assessments such as YouScience and SCOIS, "Lunch with Leaders", Virtual Job Shadowing, and off-campus experiences.
