They are on track to receive this award again for 2016!

## **PERFORMANCE GOALS**

## **School Intervention Team (SIT)**

 NAMS SIT reviews multiple sources to determine academic and behavioral needs of all students. The SIT team recommends appropriate research-based strategies, supports on-going progress monitoring to drive instruction, recommends referrals for evaluation for possible special education services or section 504 plan services.

#### **Enrichment Classes and Labs**

- NAMS offers small enrichment classes in ELA and Math.
- NAMS has two labs used for a variety of programs such as MobyMax, USA TestPrep, and NewsELA to help students improve their skills.
- Literacy Time and Read 180 were implemented.
- Jacket Time continues to be available for tutoring and reading initiates.

## **HIGHLIGHTS OF 2015-2016**

#### **NAMS SIC:**

- SIC will assist with the 2nd Annual NAMS Extreme STEAM event on May 20, 2016.
- Identified key issues that needed to be addressed: (Parent Involvement, Home-School Relations, Security.)
- Reviewed the 2015 SC Annual School Report Card Summary and addressed areas of concern.

#### 8th Grade:

- Students and teachers participated in a "Dress Like a Pirate Day" activity to culminate the Pirate unit of study.
- Students interacted with Colonial re-enactor Gwen Spivey. They learned about Colonial life as it was in the backcountry of South Carolina.
- Students attended a field trip to USC-Aiken and the Aiken County Career and Technology Center which highlighted high school and college programs.
- GT students traveled to Washington, DC, to study important memorials, buildings, and museums such as Lincoln Memorial, Arlington Cemetery (chosen to participate in the Wreath Laying Ceremony at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier), Smithsonian and a number of other attractions.
- Participated in two service learning activities. They raised money for the Syrian refugees and cut out shoe patterns for the impoverished in Uganda.

## 7th Grade:

- Engineers from SRS and part of the Traveling Science Demonstration Program through Ruth Patrick Science Education Center provided hands-on activities and demonstrations about Matter.
- Science classes participated in a frog dissection project.
- GT students traveled to Alabama to Space Camp.
- Students visited the Silver Bluff Audubon Center to engage in hands-on-activities related to Ecology.

#### 6th Grade:

- GT students traveled to Alabama to Space Camp.
- Students participated in an "on-campus" field trip that focused on STEAM.
- Students visited Medieval Times in Atlanta, GA as well as the Imperial Theatre for the Nutcracker.
- Students participated in a variety of clubs geared towards their individual interest.

#### **More Highlights:**

- 2015-2016 NAMS PTO hosted the annual Transition Fair for rising 6th grade students.
- Exploratory teachers offered STEAM night in conjunction with the 6th grade band concert.
- NAHS students presented FBLA projects at NAMS.
- Local writer and North Augusta historian, Wayne O'Bryant spoke to our 8<sup>th</sup> grade about the Civil Rights Movement.
- 400+ students participated in the NAMS Science Fair.

#### HIGHLIGHTS CONTINUED....

- Engineering Day was coordinated through Career Guidance for Science classes grades 6-8. Employees of Kimberly Clark offered interactive lessons in Polymer, Density and Diaper Experiment.
- Local Business and Industry employees participated in Career Awareness activities and "Lunch with Leaders" throughout the school year. Students in grades 6–8 had opportunities to learn about different careers and educational requirements necessary in today's job market. Over 50 sessions were offered.
- NAMS provides information to parents through several routes of communication such as Black Board Connect, an email and calling post, "The Buzz," our bi-weekly newsletters, and the school website.
- Eighth grade students participated in CHOICES, a two day program that presents real-life decision making strategies.
- Volunteer Training was presented to over 200 parents who were interested in the opportunity to be more involved in the school and to assist in student and school excellence.
   Parents use their training to assist at athletic, PTO, field trip and other school events.
- The Student Ambassadors Program was initiated with 61 members grades 6-8. The program built community partnerships with the NA Chamber of Commerce, Buzz on Bizz, and the Augusta GreenJackets. Ambassadors were offered a number of off-campus experiences that focused on leadership, business, careers, and interpersonal skills.
