Report To Parents

Spring 2021 Preliminary MAP Results (6/1/21)

- In Spring 2021, 3rd-grade students MAP Reading was at the 58th median percentile at MHES and MAP Math was at the 63rd median percentile.
 - In SC READY Math, 24% of students in grades 3-5 at Minnie Hughes score Meets or Exceeds.
 - 48% Third grade students scored meets or exceeds in SC READY Math.
 - Created a new award for classes in the cafeteria **Golden Spoon Award**.
 - Created a partnership with our Daypoter team to help decide winner of Golden Spoon and help with recycling each week. .
 - Created new award recognition for students: **Ambassador of the Month**
 - Created new award recognition for Teachers/Staff that includes parent input: **Marvelous Mini-Cat Award**
 - Created Ambassador Leadership Program to include 20 Students from 3rd, 4th, and 5th Grade
 - Established student-led Conferences
 - Implementing the personalized learning model/data driven instruction
 - Created Minnie Hughes Running Club
 - Created Minnie Hughes Gold Club
 - Implemented **Perfect Attendance Award Celebrations**
 - **Created Principal's List Breakfast for each 9 weeks**
 - 1:1 technology devices K-5th grade
 - First **Virtual** Family Literacy Monthly Read Aloud Nights
 - Continued Partnership with the Gaillard Auditorium
 - MHE House System was implemented
 - Partnered with local businesses to host 3 separate successful Spirit Night Events
 - Implemented 21st Century Tutoring Program for students
 - Students created & hosted weekly news show
 - Partnered with the Lowcountry Food Bank to send 1,000 bags of food home with MHE students
 - Distributed 5,440 snacks to students
 - Increased college awareness by **creating and promoting** "College Wear Wednesdays"
 - Participated in the -----Challenge
 - Encouraged diverse learners by celebrating **Hispanic Heritage Month, Black History Month, Women's History Month**, with trivia, decorating contests and more
 - Learned to wear masks, managed learning through plexiglass, kept space between learners, learned how and when to quarantine, how to recover from the Covid slide, and how to build a community despite all of these challenges!



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
