



Academic Programs

One of our goals this year is to increase teacher leadership and student voices. Partnering with leading educators, a teacher from each grade level will participate in math professional development and lead their professional learning communities. They will support their colleagues' learning in the three mathematical shifts of conceptual understanding, procedural skills, and application.

Every day, students produce our morning broadcast highlighting school information and current events. Our media specialist and school counselor offer students opportunities to learn about broadcast journalism and production.

We focus on careers in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) fields. We collaborated with the Naval Information Warfare Centers (NIWIC) to learn about geospatial technology and its use in several

occupations, and we did hands-on activities with Boeing to learn about aeronautical engineering.

Honors and Awards

Our students are celebrated for their academic performance and are recognized as visionary scholars, receiving recognition from the principal.

Community Outreach

Our students give in various ways. For example, our student council, teachers, and staff have organized, collected, and distributed food to help support needy families. We support Susan G. Komen's Race for the Cure and have raised a generous amount of money and awareness to fund cancer research.
