




- Curriculum: Implement comprehensive) programs addressing real world topics and real world application.
- Culture and Climate: Implement a school-wide positive behavior intervention and support (PBIS) system to promote a positive school culture and reduce discipline referrals. This included regular recognition and celebrations for positive behavior, as well as targeted interventions for students who need additional support.
