
NORTH AUGUSTA HIGH SCHOOL



Mission

NAHS is a comprehensive four-year high school with a diverse population of over 1,600 students. Accredited through the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, NAHS is a member of the High Schools That Work Alliance, a whole school research-based reform effort.



Academics

NAHS has maintained an excellent participation rate in AP programming over the last decade, with over 300 students participating in AP programming during the 2024-2025 school year

Dual-enrollment program participation grew, with students earning credit through Aiken Technical College and USC-Aiken

The faculty at NAHS is committed to continuous improvement using data and research-based practices to guide instruction.

As an academic organization, we believe:

- Our teaching should evoke curiosity and global awareness from students.
- Our speech and actions towards students and each other should come from a place of empathy.
- Our philosophies should involve a dedication to increasing students' sense of social awareness and social responsibility.
- Our practice should value both college and career paths and celebrate them equally.

Although classroom learning is vital, experiential learning through internships, research and service learning enhances the academic setting and brings lasting knowledge

NAHS strives to ensure that all graduating students are college and career ready by offering college and career assessments to all 3rd year students. The emphasis on college readiness assessments can be seen in student scholarship earnings in excess of \$15 million dollars for the class of 2024

Academic Data

Over 22% of student body enrolled in AP courses

Over 100% increase in qualifying AP scores between 2016-2024

Over 98% of 2024 graduates had post-secondary placements in college acceptance, military, or career placements

Over 90% of 2024 graduates were accepted to a two- or four-year college

NAHS Counseling

NAHS Guidance continued the "March Madness" program for seniors, with a month-long thematic program for college and career preparation

Seniors were provided opportunities for over 250 scholarships, including local, national, and international programs

All students received individual graduation plan meetings with an opportunity to select relevant and rigorous coursework with a focus on goals after graduation earnings in excess of \$15 million dollars for the class of 2024

Senior Field Day was planned and will be held on May 2nd, 2025, celebrating Senior Students for their accomplishments in the classroom and within the community

Freshman expo was held on April 24th, with hundred of rising freshman and their parent attending. Students received special information, a welcome from our Principal, and were able to explore the campus and visit staff, learn about co-curricular opportunities, and network with peers from other middle schools

NAHS Juniors had the exciting opportunity to visit USC Aiken for Junior Preview Day! They explored the campus on a guided tour, attended an informative session, and engaged with College Deans and current Pacer students to learn more about academic programs and campus life

Grand Canyon University sponsored six students on a three day trip to Grand Canyon University to tour the campus and learn about their selected programs. They also enjoyed a GCU basketball game and baseball game

Eleven Senior Students were accepted into Presbyterian College on instant decision day

Students who passed the EOC or Win Testing were treated to a Papa John's lunch.

On Friday, February 28th, North Augusta High School celebrated Black History Month with its annual Black History program. It was held to celebrate the sacrifices and contributions of the many great men and women who have enriched our history. Our guest speaker was Brandon Jamison. Mr. Jamison, a graduate of Denmark-Olar High School and South Carolina State University, spoke to our students about the rich history of black Americans, and encouraged all students to recognize their worth

"Find a Job" Friday was held with Kimberly Clark and SC Works, offering jobs and trade scholarships to students

Student and Co-Curricular Highlights

FLAIR, or Foreign Language Alliance for International Rapport, is an organization that recognizes outstanding students taking foreign language classes. Students who are nominated for this award must be members of FLAIR Honor Society, and have taken at least 3 years of a foreign language

Concert and Symphonic Orchestra earned *Superior with Distinction* Awards, the highest rating available for a performing ensemble, for the first time in program history

NAHS Orchestra held its Community Night at YourPie of North Augusta, raising money for the Orchestra program

63 NAHS Orchestra and Band students participated in this year's Garcia Orchestra Festival, representing our school with professionalism and musicianship, and performed a concert

New clubs were sponsored including the American Sign Language, Pickleball and Cornhole club, and the Jacket Elite Dance Team

Students stepped into leadership roles, experiencing firsthand how local government operates. They toured key city facilities, including the Water Treatment Plant, Public Safety Fire Station, and SRP Park, gaining insight into essential city services. Later in the evening, they attended the City Council meeting, where Mayor Briton Williams and the Council recognized their participation. A special presentation was made in partnership with the Optimist Club and City of North Augusta

Collectively, repair classes for this school year have completed almost 1000 laptop repairs for the school system. We have 3 students completing apprenticeships at SRNS, and current juniors are preparing to interview to fill those youth apprentice positions for next year. We have 47 new pathway completers this year. On May 28th, we will celebrate 33 seniors as CTE Pathway completers for Information Support & Services at the district CTE completer ceremony

NAHS FBLA competed at the SC FBLA State competition, with many students qualifying for Nationals. FBLA also sponsored and staffed two blood drives, with dozens of pints of blood donated to our local community.
