### **Mission Statement**

The mission of NAHS is to graduate students with the competence to contribute substantially to our world and to become effective lifelong learners and responsible citizens.

NAHS is a comprehensive four year high school with a diverse population of 1600 students. It is accredited through the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, and is a member of *High Schools That Work* Alliance, a whole school research-based reform effort.

As required by South Carolina law the School Improvement Council has prepared this report on NAHS's progress in meeting goals, and to highlight accomplishments.

### **Academics**

NAHS course selection includes: Dual Credit, Advanced Placement, Honors, College Preparatory, Applied Technology, and Exceptional Education.

The faculty at NAHS is committed to continuous improvement using data and research based practices to guide instruction. Early Release Day each month allows teachers time to plan together for curriculum consistency.

NAHS has introduced a school-wide writing program with a rubric that can be adapted across the curriculum. Students are assigned a writing project each month in one of their core classes.

#### 2011 Data

- 92.9% High School Exit Exam (HSAP).
- 260 Students took 390 Advanced Placement exams with 45% attaining a passing score of 3-5 (176 exams passed)!
- ACT composite score 21.4 (109 students).
- SAT composite score 1438 (71% of Seniors).
- Graduation rate: 74.7%.

NAHS offers a Credit Recovery Program and extended learning days to assist students who are academically behind.

We have continued to emphasize technology in the classroom with the addition of a technology classroom and two mobile classroom labs. All classrooms have been updated with overhead projection capability from computers. We will add at least five Smart Boards next year. Quarterly Rewards Program implemented to recognize individual students for improvements in academics, attendance and behavior

# **School Operations Funding**

According the 2011 State Report Card per pupil spending for NAHS is \$5,559, down 13.6% from the previous year. Budget cuts have resulted in a decrease in the number of teachers, an increased

class size, and a need for teachers to teach 5.5 periods of the 7 period day.

### **Goals for 2012-2013**

As part of the school's continuous improvement plan, NAHS has set the following goals:

- Expand the use of data to differentiate instruction and implement Common Core Standards.
- Implement nine Honors Academies offering students the opportunity to earn a graduation cord and schoolbased diploma in one of nine different academic areas.
- Establish a Freshman Academy for effective transition into high school.
- Expand our student mentoring program to include community volunteers to serve as mentors.
- Continue to seek ways to strengthen parents and the community partnerships in addressing student need to improve graduation rates.

# **Update on School Facilities**

In 1969 NAHS moved to its present location, with additions built in 1975, 1986, and 1992. With increases in curriculum requirements for graduation and student population growth, facility expansion and upgrade is needed.
