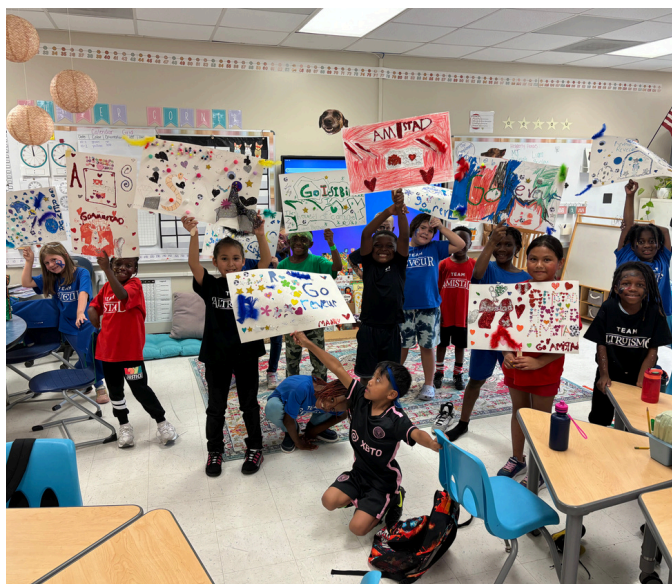


OUR VISION
