Our instruction follows the South Carolina State Curriculum Standards and incorporates integrated learning through the arts. Students enhance their creativity by attending classes in Art, Music, PE, Drama, and Dance. Teachers from the fine arts also work with students and general education teachers by co-teaching standards-based lessons that incorporate various art forms.

COVID ADAPTATIONS AT JENNIE MOORE:

Most of our students returned to in-person learning with the covid protocols of washing hands, wearing a mask, and social distancing still in effect. After the winter break, the mask mandate was lifted. We continued to utilize some virtual platforms to allow students and parents to participate in school activities. In the spring, field trips were reinstated, and PTA covered the expenses for one field trip per grade level.

JME is a Positive Behavior Interventions and Support (PBIS) school. PBIS is a proactive approach to improving student behavior by providing teachers and students with a common vocabulary and a clearly defined set of expectations. JME's BIG 3 behavior expectations are: BE SAFE, BE RESPECTFUL, and BE RESPONSIBLE. PBIS at JME is founded upon the core principles that ALL students can learn to make good behavior choices, consequences are corrective and not merely punitive, and teachers have a system for regularly and routinely recognizing and rewarding the positive behavior choices of their students.

Virtual ELA Night

The ELA Escape Room, sponsored by the School Improvement Council (SIC) is a virtual family event (replacing traditional in-person Family ELA night), where families have one week to answer Language Arts related questions online to solve "The Mystery of the Color Changing Pencil". The content focused on key concepts identified by grade level MAP test scores and teacher input. All participating families receive a small prize, and the class with the most participation at each level wins a pizza party. Random drawings for participation are done throughout the week as well. 530 students participated in the 2022 ELA Escape Room.
