The arts program provides an opportunity for all children to learn and develop their creativity through Art, Music, PE, Drama, Dance, and Technology.

The Jennie Moore Experience

Learning For All Students:

In the thirteenth year of implementation, Jennie Moore has continued to administer the MAP test to all students. Students are assessed in the areas of Reading and Math. Teachers use this information to plan for, and guide, their instruction.

Teacher Collaboration:

Classroom teachers and special area teachers collaborate to provide students with integrated learning experiences. Grade level curriculum standards are infused in the arts program and the arts standards are infused in the classroom. Teachers and specialists work together to develop intervention programs for students needing additional assistance.

Technology Enhanced:

As a 1:1 iPad school, all students receive an iPad to use during their daily instruction. Each classroom is equipped with an interactive SMARTboard for student use. Additionally, there are four computer labs in the building.

Community

- JME teachers, staff and students support over a dozen charities by raising funds and awareness for these programs. One of our largest fundraising charity events was **Jump Rope For Heart**.
- Quarterly, Finding Out With Your Administrators offers all parents an
 opportunity for open discussions with the administration on current topics of
 interest.
- Students collected hundreds of gently used books for the local non-profit,
 Book Angels.
- Our Clemson vs Carolina themed Food Drive to benefit the ECCO brought in over 800lbs of non-perishable food items.
- Community members volunteered to share their experiences and professions, as a part of our annual **Career Fair** and **Truck Rodeo**.

Literacy Initiatives

- The Literacy Team, organized and implemented several initiatives to encourage both students and families to read throughout the year.
- Fountas and Pinnell Benchmark
 Assessment System was used to assess and monitor reading progress of all students in first through fifth grade.
- A Scholastic Book Fair was held to raise funds to purchase materials for our Media Center.
- The Literacy Team celebrated summer readers, and awards were given to top readers in grades pre-k through fifth grade.
- Media Center sponsored a Reading Rivalry between USC and Clemson fans to support reading for pleasure. The media center also brought author Patricia Polacco to JME in Feb.
- JME's Second Grade teamed up with the Riverdogs to Read Around the Bases and earn a visit to the ballpark.

Healthy School Initiatives

- In conjunction with National Center for Safe Routes to School, JME sponsored a Bike Safety Rodeo in November.
- JME is proud of our **Healthy School Initiative** aimed at helping children make conscious choices in fueling their bodies and exercising. Offered this year were programs such as:
- Taste It Tuesdays Children were encouraged to try a new fruit/vegetable on Taste It Tuesday each month.
- Fit Kids— Children participated in organized fitness activities on the monthly basis, during their recess time.
- Walk to School— Students and families walked a 1.5 mile course to school in both Fall and Spring.
- **JME students and parents** participated in several fun runs and fitness events, including the **Monarch March** obstacle course.
- Staff at JME have participated in afternoon Barre,
 Yoga, and strength training classes at JME.
- In partnership with the local Rotary chapter, JME's Nutrition Club provided at-risk students with nutritious food over the weekends.
- In coordination with the school clinic, students received services from a **Dental Van** two times during the year.

- PTA Reflections is a national art competition that encourages students to create works of art based on a theme. Many pieces of art were submitted by our students. Students earned awards at the District and State levels.
- Engaging Creative Minds integrates creative experiences with community artists into the curriculum for students in grades K-5.
- JME has partnered with Charleston Museum to develop traveling trunks for teachers throughout the Charleston area to use in the classroom.

Enhancing Our Students

- I-Beam Program supported students with weekly one-on-one mentoring. Mentors read with students for thirty minutes and then joined them for lunch and special bonding time.
- Universal Screening for all kindergarten students helps identify those students at-risk and needing additional help as first graders.
- JME participates in Core Essentials rewarding students for positive character development.
- Through the Kiwanis' Terrific Kid Program,
 JME students are recognized for positive behavior.
- The SIC and PTA hosted a Parent School Security Meeting with a member of the Mt. Pleasant Swat Team and the Head of Security for CCSD.
- JME staff members organized a Math Night, for students and parents, filled with math games, prizes, and fun.
