

SIC Annual Goals

- ♦ By the spring of 2019, the on-time graduation rate for our students will be 88% as indicated on the school report card, and we will sustain this graduation rate.

Student Achievements

- The 2017 senior class received over \$1,174,939 in scholarships with 15 qualifying for the Life scholarship and finishing with a 89% grad rate with 76% enrolling in post-secondary education and/or training.
- RSMMHS True Blue Band regularly celebrates 1st place finishes and Superior ratings.
- Our students compete in many sports to include: football, volleyball, basketball, wrestling, track & field, softball, baseball, soccer, and golf.
- Our athletes received many awards including five athletes who received All State honors for fall and winter sports: two in football, one in volleyball, and one each in girls and boys basketball. The RSM Boys Basketball team are the Class A 2017-2018 Upper State Champions!
- Our Health Occupations Students of America team continued to earn high honors at the state competition with the 1st ever RSM student elected as a State HOSA President.
- The Drama class once again participated in the Aiken County Garcia Festival, earning praise for its efforts and several awards.
- 3 students participated in the 2017 SC Chamber of Commerce Business Week.
- Our students participated in the Hour of Code Initiative, IT-ology and Introduction to Coding.
- 24 participated with the Everfi: Financial Literacy Program
- 15 MTU Girls Day participants

School Achievements

- RSMMHS increased advanced learning opportunities to include AP course offerings, Teacher Cadets through USC-Aiken, ATC courses for HS dual enrollment and dual enrollment HS credit courses for middle school students.
- Our counselor, career specialist, students and their parents completed 100% of scheduled IGP & ILP meetings.
- The middle and high school band, chorus, drama and Art classes joined together in December & in May to hold Fine Arts Night in the gymnasium. They also participated in the Morris Museum of Arts Combining Voices Competition.
- This school year, the school continued a character education program in conjunction with a renewed mentor program and an outreach program for at-risk students as well as developed school-based entrepreneurship opportunities.
- Middle school students participated in Future City, MathCounts, CSRA Science Fair, District Spelling Bee, Geography Bee as well as band and sports to include: football, basketball, volleyball, cheerleading, as well as HS level track, soccer, baseball and softball.
