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## School Purpose

Ridge Spring-Monetta Middle/High School will consistently provide avenues for our students to become lifelong learners and productive members of the community.

## School Direction

Ridge Spring-Monetta High School is the center of the community.

- In collaboration with our students and parents, we focus on academic skills, with a priority on reading comprehension, writing clarity, and problem solving skills.
- We develop lifelong learners who are responsible and productive members of the community.
- Our students develop effective communication skills that facilitate their long term success beyond the classroom.
- We promote social and cultural awareness and understanding, so that our students, staff and faculty understand and accept diversity, in the school and within the community, and globally.
- Our students are technologically competent and responsible.
- We remain connected to the community through all available means.

## Student Achievements

- The 2014 senior class received over \$900,000 in scholarships. Seventeen seniors received the Life Scholarship.
- The middle/high band competed in the USC-A concert festival, receiving a rating of Excellent for its performance.
- The middle/high marching band took part in four competitions, earning an Excellent rating in each, and advancing to the Lower State Championships. Next year, they plan to place at the State Championships.
- Seven athletes received all-state honors for fall and winter sports: four in football, two in volleyball, and one in girls basketball.
- Our Health Occupations Students of America president earned second place at the state competition in Medical Reading.
- The Drama class once again participated in the Aiken County Garcia Festival, earning praise for its efforts and several awards.

## School Achievements

- RSMMSHS improved to Good on the state report card, improving graduation rate from 75% to 82%.
- Our career counselor, students and their parents completed 100% of scheduled IGP meetings.
- The middle and high school band, chorus, drama and Art classes joined together in December to hold our first annual Fine Arts Night in the gymnasium.
- The RSM High School 2013-14 teacher of the year, Mrs. Kayla Hostetler, was selected to the Aiken County Teacher of the Year Honor Court.
- This school year, the school implemented a character education program, in conjunction with a renewed mentor program and an outreach program for at-risk students.
