Student Achievement

Sanders Clyde Elementary MAP Progress:

MAP, or the Measure of Academic Progress, is a computerized adaptive test which helps teachers, parents, and administrators improve learning for all students and make informed decisions to promote a child's academic growth. Sanders Clyde Elementary School students participate in this nationally recognized assessment during three testing windows each year, Fall, Winter, and Spring. For the 2017-2018 school term, Sanders Clyde has a rating of unsatisfactory.

During the first few months of school (FALL & WINTER Testing Window), students in grades 2-5 participate in two MAP testing sessions to assess Reading and Mathematics.

Scores from students in second grade from the FALL to WINTER testing window indicated that 21% met their target growth in math and 14% of students met their target growth in reading.

Scores from students in third grade from the FALL to WINTER testing window indicated that 30% met their target growth in math and 34% met their target growth in reading.

Scores from students in fourth grade from the FALL to WINTER testing window indicated that 19% met their target growth in math and 43% met their target growth in reading.

Scores from students in fifth grade from the FALL to WINTER testing window indicated that 30% met their target growth in math and 44 % met their target growth in reading.

Our scores indicate that we have the greatest gains in 5th grade and the lowest gains in 2nd grade. Our goal for the SPRING testing window is to increase 10% or greater to our target goal in each subject area for each grade level, and to have 50% of our students make their growth target. In order to make this significant impact in our scores and overall student success we've established grade level math intervention programs, Saturday enrichment school, and have a greater focus on using formative assessment to drive instruction.
