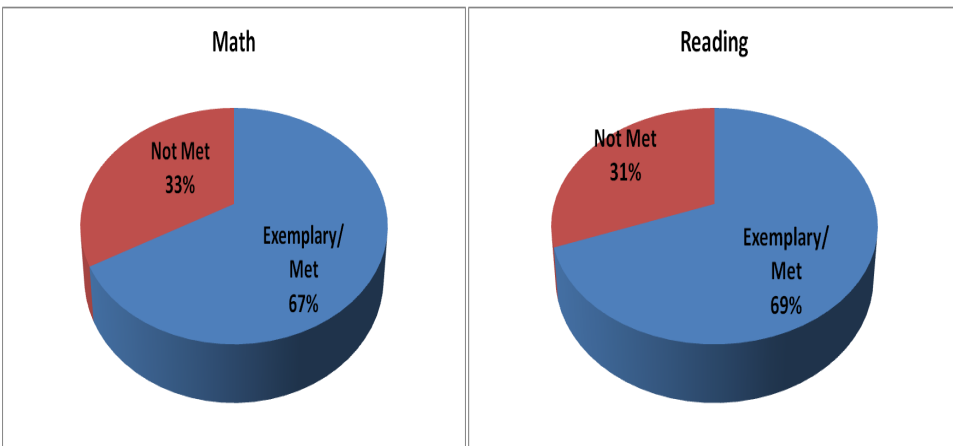
Message From The Principal
