Issued by the Sullivan's Island Elementary School Improvement Council in accordance with South Carolina law to share information on the school's progress in meeting various goals and objectives, the work of the SIC, and other accomplishments during the school year.

School Vision

To grow inquiring learners equipped with the skills to explore and contribute as stewards of the Earth and each other.

Goals

This has been a school year marked by robust collaboration among, students, staff, parents and community partners. Together we have accomplished our goal of increasing the number of students reaching their individualized MAP (Measures of Academic Progress) learning goals in reading. This year 65% of our students met or exceeded their reading goal as compared to 53.3% last year. Our math growth remained approximately the same with 54% of students



reaching their goal this year as compared to 53% last year. MAP goals are individualized and in many cases require students to master material above their grade level. We are extremely proud of our students' efforts! Additionally, we have strengthened the Coastal Environment Curriculum by aligning Ocean Literacy Principles with SC Science Standards.

School Improvement Council Survey

Each year, our School Improvement Council provides an opportunity for parents to provide feedback to be used for continuous school improvement. 184 parents completed the survey this year. Results are used to assist with planning for the upcoming school year.

Highest Satisfaction Rankings

- My child feels safe at school (100%)
- My child is treated fairly (99%)
- My child's social emotional needs (98%)
- Overall learning environment (96%)
- Thinking critically and creatively (96%)

Areas of Significant Improvement in Satisfaction Rankings

- Active play/movement (increase from 72% to 87%)
- After school activities (increase from 64% to 70%)
