ABOUT US

Sullivan's Island Elementary provides a safe, caring, and academically challenging learning environment with the guidance of our school vision: To grow inquiry-based learners equipped with the skills to explore and contribute as stewards of our world and environment.

Nestled just behind a maritime forest and directly adjacent to the Atlantic Ocean, our school is a Constituent Magnet with the school-wide theme of Coastal Environment Studies. Through the coastal environment lens, students engage in authentic math and science experiences in two specialized wet labs, explore the adjoining nature trail/beach, and develop a sense of independence and responsibility in our school garden. Students regularly create models, work in groups to solve problems and share their ideas through speaking, writing, drawing, and technology. Our three coastal environment teachers work closely with classroom teachers to focus on cross-disciplinary science instruction.

Special Area classes at Sullivan's Island Elementary include a Spanish Exposure program, art, music, physical education, coastal environment, and technology.

KEY SCHOOLWIDE CURRICULUMS THAT MAKE A DIFFERENCE

This year, teachers have worked together to implement Bridges Math and EL Reading/Writing to provide a solid literacy and numeracy foundation for students at every grade level. More robust implementation has necessitated increased planning, strategic scheduling, and team teaching.




To bolster these curriculums, staff members are currently participating in professional development based on the science of reading and mathematics. The frameworks of LETRS (literacy training) and OGAP (numeracy training) translate current educational research into a practical approach that helps teachers deliver highly effective instruction to meet **all** student's needs. These trainings help support EL and Bridges by providing teachers with the knowledge and tools behind **how** students learn. In turn, our staff has increased efforts to provide our families with the tools to support their children at home. Several parents have attended parent coffee chats and utilized our new curriculum dashboard on the school's website.

DIFFERENTIATED INSTRUCTION AND SUPPORTS FOR ALL STUDENTS

Additionally, our Multi-Tiered System of Supports team (MTSS), meets weekly to assess student performance and find ways to ensure all students reach their full potential. This is accomplished with resources such as personnel and programming for reading and math interventions, as well as classroom support. The SIES MTSS team continues to receive the highest ratings for comprehensively implementing universal supports for all students. As a result, the iReady data at each grade level reflects an increase not just in achievement, but in overall student growth.



SUPPORT FOR TEACHERS IN TODAY'S WORLD IS CRITICAL

At times overlooked, many factors impact teacher morale and wellness. Tragic school shootings, social media, curriculum debates, and the rising cost of affordable housing are just a few of the challenges. To continue to boost staff wellness and morale, we have worked hard to increase two-way communication between parents, administration, and teachers. Additionally, our PTA, Friends Group, volunteers, business partners, and parents from every grade level have gone above and beyond by showering the teachers with appreciation throughout the year. This year, the SIES staff was treated to Woot Woot Wagon visits, Rise and Shine Breakfasts, lunches during Professional Development days, teacher supply monies, and an amazing Teacher Appreciation week. Volunteers have graciously given their time and talents to help build and launch our first miniboat, monitor classes at lunch, provide copy services for teachers, assist

with special area classes, the library, and during coastal days. These efforts are so appreciated and tangibly impact our overall school climate.

SCHOOL SAFETY AND COMMUNITY

Speaking of safety and security, our School Safety Team meets monthly to review schoolwide systems and special events to ensure safety and security. The team consists of Sullivan's Island Fire Department, Police Department, and Town officials, as well as the school resource officer, administration, nurse, Kaleidoscope director, counselor, custodian, secretary, teachers, and parents. CCSD and the Charleston County Sheriff's Department also worked closely with SIES to staff the school with our outstanding new School Resource Officer (SRO), Deputy Ross. Perhaps most notably, in the area of safety improvements, parents, students, and staff have improved compliance with safety guidelines. This consistent teamwork not only increases safety, but it increases peace of mind for everyone in our school community.

ACADEMIC GROWTH

The charts on the following 2-pages provide the percentage of students in Kindergarten through Fifth grade who met their individual goals on iReady Math and Reading for the 2022-2023 school year. For reference, i-Ready is an online program for reading and/or mathematics that helps a teacher determine a student's needs, personalize his/her learning, and monitor progress throughout the school year. i-Ready allows each teacher to meet his/her students exactly where they are and provides data to increase student learning gains. i-Ready consists of two parts: Diagnostic and Personalized Instruction.

The i-Ready Diagnostic is an adaptive assessment that adjusts its questions to suit a student's needs. Each item a student sees is individualized based on his/her answer to the previous question. For example, a series of correct answers will result in slightly harder questions, while a series of incorrect answers will yield slightly easier questions. The purpose of this is not to give each student a score or grade, but instead to determine how best to support student learning. Students take three diagnostic assessments during the school year. The initial Fall Diagnostic score is used to determine individual student growth goals.

While 50% or more of students meeting their growth goal is robust, our schoolwide goal is to continue maintaining their goals at 60% or higher. Since this is our first year administering standardized iReady testing, there is no historical data for comparison.

SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT SURVEY RESULTS

In January of 2023, our School Improvement Council created and distributed a family survey to gauge perceptions concerning one of our targeted growth areas: communication. Additionally, participants were asked to provide insight concerning programs funded by donations to the FRIENDS of Sullivan's Island Elementary School 501c3. Results from this survey were analyzed to prioritize future school goals and initiatives. The survey was distributed on January 12th and closed on January 24th through SurveyPlanet. In all, **179** parents and guardians completed the survey. Complete analysis of survey results is included below.

KEY TAKEAWAYS FROM SURVEY COMMENTS

- Families indicated a strong desire to have additional enrichment and club opportunities in the afternoon. (69.9% afternoon, 30.1% morning)
- Families indicated preference for additional enrichment/club opportunities in the area of Science/STEM and Visual Arts.
- Families noted an appreciation for the level of communication from the school and volunteer opportunities.
- Several comments made reference to a desire for increased individual feedback from their child's teacher.
- An appreciation for our Spanish Program and increased language time was also noted.
- Many references were made to continue the Parent Educator role.

NEXT YEAR

Our staff, PTA, SIC, and FRIENDS of SIES groups are working together to finalize our plan for the year ahead. After careful analysis of School Improvement Council results by our Leadership Team, Faculty Senate, and School Improvement Council, several recommendations were made to FRIENDS for funding next year. Our FRIENDS group voted to approve these recommendations, which are outlined below. Additionally, other updates concerning school initiatives are included.

SCHOOLWIDE THEME

- Soar On, Skimmers!
- Staff voted to make this our permanent theme.

SPECIAL AREA SCHEDULE

- Our Special Area schedule will revert back to a traditional 5 day a week schedule, instead of the rotating 6 day schedule.
- Spanish will be included 5 days a week, instead of 4.
- Staff and parents noted a need for consistency in this area, especially to assist with volunteering in Special Areas, such as Art.

COASTAL SCIENCE PROGRAM

- Coastal Science will no longer be a part of the Special Area Schedule.
- Instead, each class will attend a weekly Coastal Science class.

NEXT YEAR

COASTAL SCIENCE PROGRAM CONTINUED

- Classroom teachers will Co-Teach with the Coastal Science teacher to better include the whole school in the Coastal Science Program.
- The Parent Educator will continue to work with the Coastal Science Program, focusing on magnet selection, curriculum development, and community partnerships.

PROGRAMS FUNDED BY FRIENDS 501C3

- Spanish will increase to 5 days a week, based on Survey Results
- Technology (75% of Salary)
- Math and Reading Interventionists (A Portion of Salary)
- Balcony Seating and Sun Coverage
- School Dismissal Manager
- Touch Tank Maintenance and Animal Care
- Green Heart Gardening
- Teacher Supplies

VOLUNTEERING

- This year, we did an overhaul of our Volunteer system to allow more individuals access to opportunities that fit both their interests and availability.
- We will continue to expand on our volunteer system and ensure access for ALL families.

NEXT YEAR

EXTENDED PLANNING

- We will continue to provide our teachers with four extended planning opportunities throughout the 23-24 school year.
- Extended planning allows our teachers the opportunity to collaborate, review data, and engage in meaningful planning to ensure the highest level of instruction.
