

The goals set forth this year by SIC have focused on improving and sustaining new and old traditions that will leave thumb prints in our students' lives and will encourage them to continue supporting the arts for years to come.

FINE ARTS

BAND

- 5 students in All-State HS Jazz Band, 77 in Region 4 Bands, 20 students in the SC All-State MS & HS Band, and 5 MS students in the SC All State Orchestra
- Wind Ensemble featured performance at USC Band Clinic & Music For All Southeastern Regional Concert Festival. Jazz Band featured performance at the SCMEA Conference
- Superior with Distinction, at the State Concert Performance Assessment.

CREATIVE WRITING

- 10 national Scholastic Art and Writing Awards, including National Scholastic Gold Portfolio & \$12,500 scholarship (one of 16 given nationwide), a Best in Grade, and an American Voices Medal.
- 229 Regional Scholastic Writing Awards, including a senior portfolio award for every member of the creative writing class.
- A National YoungArtist Award from the The National Foundation for the Advancement of Artists.
- Finalist, National Student Poets Program

DANCE

- Two students per year are awarded the Slowinski Summer Study Scholarship for summer intensive participation around the nation. 90% of Students in the National Honor Society for Dance Arts Graduate with Honors.
- High school dancers were selected to perform at the Piccolo Spoleto festival.
- Students have had 7 week-long guest residencies from master dancers and choreographers, as well as former SOA alumni speaking about their college and professional achievements.

PIANO

- Competed in 8 local and state competitions and won five first place (including 1st in state & division), six 2nd place, 2 runner up, 7 honorable mentions, 4 alternate, 12 honors recitalists, and 9 honors recipients (most in SC) and 3 student advanced to the National Competition.
- 15 students selected to work with professors from CofC, USC, Clemson, & Ohio State. Masterclasses & concert collaborations with Charleston Jazz. Accepted into summer camps at Furman University & Brevard Music Center. Awarded 5 CSOL Scholarships.

VISUAL ARTS

- 97 Regional Awards, 3 National Winners; Best of Show & 38 winners of SEWE Federal Duck Stamp Competition, 1st place Birdhouse & Honorable Mention Photography for Kids for Conservation, & Birdhouse Sculpture Competitions, 10 awards & \$8850 of Scholarships awarded for Charleston Artist Guild Senior Art Show. 41 accepted into Art Fields Jr. N. Charleston Arts Festival Youth Art & Sculpture competition
- 1st place in middle AND 1st place in high school for SCAEA's Youth Art Month

ORCHESTRA

- Performed at the Midwest Intn'l. Band & Orchestra Clinic in Chicago. SOA is the first South Carolina High School since the 1980's to have their orchestra invited to perform at this event.
- 25 High School students and 15 MS students made 2025 All-State Orchestra
- Both MS & HS awarded Superior with Distinction at the 2025 SC Concert Performance Assessment

VOCAL MUSIC

- Both Middle and High choirs had the largest number of students from any school in the state selected for the ACDA and SCMEA All-State Choirs.
- Sold-out shows of The Sound of Music with our Symphony Orchestra.

THEATRE ARTS

- State Thespian Festival: SOA Theatre's One Act Play The Insanity of Mary Girard received the highest rating and point total. Winner of state Thespian & Blair Beasley Scholarships, awarded 63 Superiors.
- 18 State-wide performances by the Fighting Gnomes HS Improv Troupe
- 25 unique shows in the 24-25 School Year with over 1000 performances.

FASHION AND DESIGN

• SOA fashion designers created over 150 fabulous garments for the annual Fashion Show that incorporated all SOA majors as models. Seniors Fashion Show at the Gibbes Art Museum.
