In an effort to improve the level of rigor and relevance of instruction the principal, leadership team, and SIC developed the School Renewal and Title I plans with the following initiatives and goals:

- ◆ Provide continuous professional learning opportunities for faculty members on best instructional practices
- ◆ Analyze various test data to differentiate instruction, set school and student growth targets, and plan instruction
- ◆ Conduct a minimum of 2 parent data chats a year (1st Semester & 2nd Semester)
- ◆ Use iReady to supplement and inform instruction in reading and math using the Tool Box, Customize lessons, and Standards Mastery
- ◆ Provide opportunities for parents to connect to curriculum expectations by sponsoring literacy, math, STEAM Nights, and parenting activities
- ◆ Promote school-wide whole and small group instruction for reading and math in all classrooms
