In an effort to improve the level of rigor and relevance of instruction the principal, leadership team, and SIC developed the School Renewal and Title I plans with the following initiatives and goals:

- ◆ Provide continuous professional learning opportunities for faculty members on best instructional practices
- ◆ Analyze various test data to differentiate instruction, set student growth targets, and plan instruction
- ◆ Use adaptive digital content to supplement instruction in reading, math, social studies and science such as: IXL and iReady to name a few
- ◆ Provide opportunities for parents to connect to curriculum expectations by sponsoring virtual literacy, math, and parenting activities
- ◆ Provide an extended year and day program through the Community of Schools (Kaleidoscope & Epic in the summer) and Outschool.Org (virtual supplementary instruction)
- ◆ Promote school-wide balanced literacy through the implementation of reader's and writer's workshop and cross curricular vocabulary strategies
- ◆ Through play-based instruction, our Child Development Program focuses on language/literacy, numeracy, and social-emotional development.
