

### NOTABLE SCHOOL & STUDENT ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- West Ashley High School proudly earned a "Good" rating on the SC School Report Card for the first time in years! This significant achievement reflects the dedication and hard work of our entire school community.
- National Honor Society graduating seniors collectively maintained a 4.35 GPA and accumulated over 3,000 community service hours in the past 2 years
- West Ashley Orchestra received a rating of "Excellent" for their 2025 SC Concert Performance Assessment
- One hundred forty-one graduating seniors earned CTE completer status
- Three thousand+ community members attended our annual "Wildcat Trunk-or-Treat" event
- One hundred twenty West Áshley students are enrolled in the College of Charleston Scholars Academy Program. This year's graduating cohort has completed 216 classes on the College of Charleston campus over the course of their senior year
- Dr. Brandt was named CCSD "Rookie Principal of the Year" for the 2024-2025 school year
- Ms. Megan Kee, our 2024-2025 West Ashley High School Teacher of the Year, was selected as a CCSD Teacher of the Year Top 5 Finalist
- Senior PACKs participated in "Passion Project" this year, one of the groups raising over \$1200 for the Lowcountry Orphan Relief Fund
- NJROTC program hosted Vice Admiral Karl Thomas of the United States Navy in November
- West Ashley hosted the CCSD Leadership Press Conference for district leadership in January
- Members from the West Ashley DECA and NJROTC volunteered and supported community members at the 48th annual Cooper River Bridge Run
- Multiple West Ashley athletic feams made regional playoff appearances
- One West Ashley student athlete won a State Championship in swimming
- Nine West Ashley student athletes won the Region Championships in swimming
- Forty-eight West Ashley student athletes were named All-Region Athletes
- Four West Ashley student athletes were named All-State Athletes
- Seventeen West Ashley student athletes committed to play at the collegiate level

## **KEY INITIATIVES AND STRATEGIC APPROACHES FOR IMPROVEMENT**

### **IMPROVE STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT**

- Targeted Interventions: Every 4.5 weeks, student progress is monitored to identify those in need of additional academic support and potential SLT enrollment, where students receive targeted assistance, in lieu of ILT, until they show adequate academic progress in the next monitoring check.
- Academic Support: Regularly offer academic interventions like content and credit recovery, and strategically use SLT for individualized support.
- Staff Development: Prioritized high expectations, relevant professional learning, and opportunities for staff to collaborate, analyze data, and refine instructional strategies.
- Maximizing AP and Dual Enrollment Pathways: Increased awareness and access to our strong selection of AP and Dual Enrollment opportunities. This includes hosting "AP and Dual Enrollment" information nights for students and parents.

### **INCREASE STUDENT ENGAGEMENT**

- Student Dialogue Circles: Hosted numerous student dialogue circles throughout the year. These sessions brought together diverse student groups to discuss their thoughts and experiences, allowing us to gather valuable feedback
- Involvement Opportunities: Expanded our extracurricular offerings based on student interest. We also made a concerted effort to highlight and promote our existing clubs and extracurricular events during key events like "Freshmen Orientation," "Fall Open House," our "Fall Club Fair," and our "West Ashley Spotlight" event.
- Cultivating Peer Mentorship: Grade-level PACK (credit bearing course) groups participated in a peer mentorship program, collaborating with other PACKs. This fostered a supportive environment where students could advise and assist one another.
- Broadening Student Recognition: Recognized student achievements beyond just academics, highlighting and celebrating qualities such as preparedness, advocacy, collaboration, and kindness. This was done through school-wide recognition programs and social media spotlights.
- **Promoting a Positive Environment:** Utilizing our PBIS framework, student positive behavior and achievement was highlighted through shout-outs and the earning of "Cat Coins" for rewards and incentive purchases.

### STRENGTHEN COMMUNITY & FAMILY RELATIONS

- Enhanced Communication: Streamlined our school-to-home communication to better engage families. This included regular newsletters, regular updates to our school website, and an active social media presence.
- Community Partnership Development: Built new partnerships with local businesses, non-profits, and higher education institutions. These collaborations, including those through the district's LOCAL program and our PTSO, provided valuable resources and opportunities for our students, families, and faculty.
- Family Engagement Events: Hosted numerous school-wide and community events to bring
  families and community members to campus in engaging ways. Highlights included our Fact &
  Fee event, Fall Open House, Hispanic Heritage Night, "Trunk or Treat" event, numerous athletic
  community nights, and our "West Ashley Spotlight" night.
- PTSO Growth: Reinvigorated and grew our PTSO group, working closely with them to improve school involvement and connection. They actively supported teachers and students and were key participants and sponsors in all our community events.
