ACADEMICS

81 students qualified as Duke TIP recipients. Among these, 44 were enrolled and 37 tested. 6 students qualified for state recognition, 12 students qualified for Academy for Summer Studies and 2 qualified for Center for Summer Studies.

33 eighth-grade students were recognized as South Carolina Junior Scholars.

88 students took the PSAT in the fall.

100% of eighth-graders participated in the PSAT 8/9.

100% of eighth-graders passed the Algebra 1 and

99% English 1 End of Course exams (2017)

KHAN Academy accounts are available to students.

20 minutes of structured reading time is held schoolwide daily.

GUIDANCE & CAREER COUNSELING
