By the numbers

ACADEMICS

73 students qualified as Duke TIP recipients. Among these, 39 were enrolled and 36 tested. 8 students qualified for state recognition, 7 students qualified for Academy for Summer Studies and 5 qualified for Center for Summer Studies.

33 eighth-grade students were recognized as South Carolina Junior Scholars.

82 students took the PSAT in the fall.

100% of eighth-graders participated in the PSAT 8/9.

100% of eighth-graders passed the Algebra 1 and English 1 End of Course exams (2016).

20 minutes of structured reading time is held school-wide daily.

GUIDANCE & CAREER COUNSELING

More than 39 local sponsors participated in Mini Courses to expose students to a range of topics from careers to hobbies in February 2017.

Classroom guidance sessions on student success, test-taking strategies, and study skills were conducted.

100% of eighth-graders completed Individual Graduation Plans (IGPs).

100% of sixth- and seventh-graders completed Individual Learning Plans (ILPs).

Sponsored the "Meet and Greet" for our rising sixth-graders and their parents.

Held Lunch and Learn sessions where community members share knowledge and experience with small groups of students.

GRANTS

An English/Read 180 teacher received two iPads through DonorsChoose.org.

A math teacher received classroom supplies including calculators, notebooks, crayons, etc. through DonorsChoose.org.

A **science** teacher received materials for the school's recycling program through the Department of Health and Environmental Control and a grant through SRNS for the gardening class.

The **band** and **music** teachers gained musical equipment via DonorsChoose.org.

A Read 180 teacher won the Target Field Grant. She has received this grant for the past 7 years.

Three teachers have earned **SRNS** grants for robotics and STEM course work.

The **special education** teacher received \$1000 for fitness bands and \$350 for Project Unify.

Achievements

KMS BAND

Our band program includes 188 students, consisting of beginning and intermediate musicians, who in one year performed:

- 3 pep band performances,
- 7 concerts (winter concerts: 3 during school, 1 after), a holiday concert, a Veteran's Day concert, and a spring concert (including two field trips to local elementary schools)
- 9 band students were selected for Region 2 Honor band
- 17 made Aiken All County Band, and
- 1 was picked for All-State band.
- 42 students (28 entries) competed in SCBDA Solo and Ensemble Festival.
- 9 students participated in Aiken's Da Capo Band clinic.
- The Pep Band gave a joint performance with Schofield and Aiken middle schools at the Black History Month parade.
- The seventh/eighth grade honor band performed at the SCBDA performance assessment in March, then traveled to Florida to perform at the Orlandofest Music Festival and Stars Music Performance at Universal Studios.
- The Jazz Band gave three performances (Black History Month assembly, the KMS talent show, and the Middle School Open House Blitz).
- Students performed "open mic" style at two spirit nights at Chick-fil-A and Chipotle in the fall.
- Eighth grade band performed with South Aiken High School band at a SAHS football game in fall 2016.
- KMS students and parents participated in fundraisers between October 2016 and February 2017 to directly benefit music instruction at KMS.
- Still to come, a beginning band concert at the rising-sixth-grader assembly and student performances at the inaugural Aiken Fine Arts Day.
