# School Renewal Plan Goals

Increase from 50.9% (2021) to 55.9% scoring meets or exceeds on SC Ready Reading.

Increase from 48.3% (2021) to 53.3% scoring meets or exceeds on SC Ready Math.

Increase from 9.5% (2021) to 10.5% of students state identified as Gifted and Talented. [11%]

Increase from 85.1% (2021) to 86.1% of students not receiving a discipline referral.

Increase from 75.9% (2021) to 77.9% of parents satisfied with school-home relations. [88.7%]

Increase from 76.9% to 78.9% of teachers satisfied with the school's social and physical environment. [97.7%]

Reading:

1. F & P Levels:

a. Kindergarten (2022: 39%)

2. MAP Testing: 58.6% met MAP growth goals (21-22: 53.8% of students met MAP goals)

Reading:

a. 84.6% of classes had 50% of students meet their MAP reading goals.

b. 40.4% projected to be meets/exceeds (31% in 2022)

Math:

1. MAP: 73.1% of classes met 50% met MAP math reading goals.
