Student Achievement

In 2017, the SC Ready assessment was given to evaluate students in the areas of Reading, English, Mathematics, and Writing. The scoring levels for SC Ready are: Exceeds, Meets, Approaches, and Does Not Meet. The South Carolina Palmetto Assessment of State Standards (S.C. PASS) was the state's accountability measurement of student achievement for science and social studies. S.C. PASS has three scoring levels: Exemplary, Met, and Not Met.
