SIC Annual Goals

The faculty and staff of John E. Ewing Middle School will build an effective professional learning community that emphasizes best practices in teaching adolescents by participating in staff development opportunities, by conducting book studies, and by doing peer observations.

The faculty and staff of John E. Ewing Middle School will promote a positive school climate by increasing the number of parents satisfied with the learning environment, the social/physical environment, and home-school relations by a percentage point each year from 2014-2019.

The students of John E. Ewing Middle School will exceed state average on percent of students scoring Met and Exemplary on all areas of S.C. PASS (ELA=76.5%, Math=72.6%, Science=71.1%, Social Studies=75.1%) by 2019.

Student Achievement

John E. Ewing Middle School received an Average Absolute Rating and an Average Growth Rating on the 2014 S.C. Annual School Report Card. The South Carolina Palmetto Assessment of State Standards (S.C. PASS) test was the state's accountability measurement of student achievement. Students were scored in five subject areas: writing, reading and research, mathematics, science, and social studies. S.C. PASS has three scoring levels:

- Exemplary Student test performance shows strengths in the standard.
- Met Student may benefit from additional activities that focus on the standard.
- Not Met Student test performance shows weaknesses and a need for further instruction in the standard.
