The students of John E. Ewing Middle School will exceed state average on percent of students scoring Met and Exemplary on all areas of S.C. PASS (ELA=76.5%, Math=72.6%, Science=71.1%, Social Studies=75.1%) by 2019.

Student Achievement

John E. Ewing Middle School received an Average Absolute Rating and an Average Growth Rating on the 2013 S.C. Annual School Report Card. The South Carolina Palmetto Assessment of State Standards (S.C. PASS) test is currently the state's accountability measurement of student achievement. Students are scored in five subject areas: writing, reading and research, mathematics, science, and social studies. S.C. PASS has three scoring levels:

- Exemplary Student test performance shows strengths in the standard.
- Met Student may benefit from additional activities that focus on the standard.
- Not Met Student test performance shows weaknesses and a need for further instruction in the standard.
