The School Improvement Counsel is a broad-based body intended to advise the principal and school. The SIC collects data and combines the experiences of its members in an effort to make improvements to the school.

The School Improvement Council consists of the following: parents, teachers, students, and community members, the school's principal, and other ex-officio members.

South Carolina State law requires that every K-12 public school have an active SIC. The law states that it is the responsibility of the local school board to ensure SICs are constituted within each district. This includes career, vocational, and technical schools.

What do SICs do?

SIC duties focus primarily on the school improvement process. SICs should perform the following tasks:

- provide input and feedback during the development of the school's five-year renewal (improvement) plan and annual updates;
- assist in implementation of school improvement programs
 and activities;
- monitor and report on progress toward improvement goals in the annual *SIC Report to the Parents* and, with the principal in the narrative, to the *SC School Report Card*;
- provide other assistance as requested by the principal.

Gaffney High School's SIC members are excited and eager to begin this year's endeavors to support and foster positive change and improvements.

Awards, Accolades, and Scholarships

As we celebrated the graduating class of 2023, the faculty, staff, parents, and community acknowledged and celebrated various student talents and personal accomplishments. Diplomas were awarded to demonstrate completion of secondary academic goals. Congratulations to the Class of 2023!

There were 380 graduates last school year, including 54 who graduated in December (2022). Of these graduates, 274 students

received either the LIFE or HOPE scholarships. Two hundred sixty-one students achieved College and/or Career Ready status. Fourteen students were Palmetto Fellowship recipients. Nineteen seniors were recognized as AP Scholars, including one AP Scholar with Honors and six AP Scholars with Distinction. four seniors were recognized through the College Board **Recognition Program as** National Rural and Small Town awardees.
