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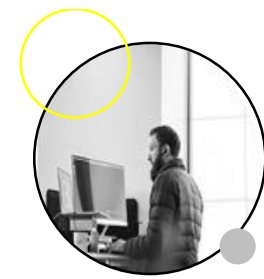
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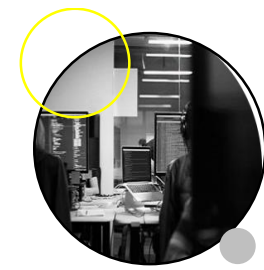
MISSION STATEMENTS

PROGRAMS, ACCOLADES, AND HONORS

Academics

Even through COVID-19's influence, Gaffney High School graduated 435 seniors who accomplished the following: over 19 million dollars awarded in scholarship money, average SAT for students that graduated in 2020 is 951. The average ACT for the juniors that took it last year was 16.6.

Athletics

Gaffney High School offers a wide variety of sports including: football, baseball, softball, basketball, golf, cross country, track, soccer, swimming, tennis, volleyball, and wrestling. Our school's history of championship status remains a continuous vision of future accomplishment where excellence will transcend on any field, pool, court, course, or mat.

Student Activities and Engagement

To develop and discover individual talents and skills, Gaffney High School offers many opportunities centered on that specific concept.

- The Band of Gold received an excellent rating at the State Marching Band Contest with a special performance at Walt Disney World in Orlando, FL. The Winter Guard earned two 1st place finishes, one 2nd place, and one 3rd place finish at Regional Winter Guard Competitions. GHS Big Band Jazz Band received a superior rating at the State Jazz Festival and the G-Town Sound received a superior rating at State Jazz Festival.
- Performing Arts/Drama-Advanced Drama class proudly attended the South Carolina Theatre Association Play Festival for the first time last year. They also completed the one-act play called "Chester, Who Painted the World Purple." They also attended monologue events at the festival, attended workshops, and met with college recruits. "virtual" festival for the South Carolina Theatre Association. They submitted a one-act play called, "The Baloney, The Pickle, The Zombies, and Other Things I Hide from my Mother" where they will compete virtually in November.

CONTINUED ACCOLADES AND HONORS

- Visual Arts: Opportunities range from intermediate to advanced levels in areas of drawing, ceramics, embroidery, photography, other forms of expression. The annual Arts Expo allows student work to be displayed from all over the district in one gallery, Gaffney High School.
- AFJROTC receiving the Distinguished Unit Award, 2000+ community service hours, 15 cadets earning national awards, and 100% cadet graduation rate.

Special Events

- AVID- Academic Support, College Readiness, and Community Service (**Advancement Via Individual Determination**) is a college-readiness system designed to increase the number of students who enroll in four-year colleges. Although AVID serves all students, it focuses on the least served students in the academic middle. #weareavid: 35 trained teachers, 6 trained administrators, 136 total students in 2020.
- Beta Clubs- Academic acknowledgement and community service are a continued success at Gaffney High School. Students, grades 9-12, are invited to join this elite group.
- Honor Societies: Gaffney High School continues to offer the Mu Alpha, the math honor, for students who qualify, but last year was also able to introduce, for the first time, the Victoria Tomlinson Chapter of the National English Honor Society. There are approximate 30 members who demonstrate excellence in reading, writing, and verbal skills.
- Leadership Opportunities- Student Council, Senate, and Student Body Officers among a variety of leadership positions and offices in special area clubs and organizations.
- Language Opportunities- Creative Writing and French and Spanish clubs are offered at Gaffney High School with leadership opportunities in all areas.
- Special Area and School Enrichment- Green Teens for improving today's environment, SPIRIT club, and the Rodeo club.
